This is an opportunity to book a place on our hosted training event which provides an opportunity for individual practitioners to complete our programme. Our multi-agency Perinatal & Infant Mental Health Champions training programme is designed to improve family mental health by:

- increasing competence and confidence in perinatal and infant mental health practice
- developing place-based leadership for perinatal and infant mental health across complex systems of care
- raising awareness of the importance of perinatal and infant mental health across the workforce

The online delivery format models our highly acclaimed face-to-face programme and will equip Champions with the necessary understanding, knowledge and competence to lead on PIMH in their local areas.

Following the training, each Champion will receive resources enabling them to cascade the training (COVID-19 permitting) onwards to their colleagues either face-to-face or virtually. The iHV will provide both face-to-face and online format training resources to support this.

We use the Zoom platform for delivery of carefully crafted lesson plans with varied teaching formats and regular breaks - we hope you enjoy the programme. We look forward to you joining the Champions movement and starting your Champions journey.

What is an iHV Champion?

Champions are distinct individuals with attributes of:

- a passion for the subject area and an ability and opportunities to be influential
- an aptitude for teaching their colleagues (not necessarily a formal qualification but experience and confidence to teach groups)
- organisation ability to organise training events deliver a cascade of the awareness training package
- the support of their organisation to deliver a cascade of awareness training (either a one day or a two day or suite of bite-sized 90-minute sessions) of awareness



training to their multi-agency colleagues. NOTE: a virtual alternative for cascade will also be made available.

During the Champion training the training you will go on to deliver is role-modelled to you over 2 days, so you are familiar with the slides, activities and management of discussions and groupwork. You will be provided with:

- A Champions Trainer pack
- Access to lesson plans, presentations and slide notes, templates for participant evaluations and attendance certificates to support you to deliver a cascade training in your local area.

Expectations of Champions

As a Champion you are committing to providing a cascade of training within your local area – within your own service and across services that you work alongside along the perinatal pathway to support inter-agency working. The frequency of your cascade will be agreed locally to fit with your capacity. As a Champion, you will be an advocate for perinatal mental health within your local area, taking an active role in this very important agenda. You will use current opportunities in your day-to-day practice and seek new opportunities to lead and advocate for perinatal and infant mental health. These opportunities and therefore the associated time spent will vary from role to role.

Ongoing support to Champions

Champions will also be given access to the vibrant regional iHV PIMH Forum. The iHV Perinatal and Infant Mental Health (PIMH) Forums were established with the aim of sustaining the confidence, competence and commitment of the iHV PIMH Champions. Over the past 5 years, the Forums have proved themselves as an extremely important part of making a difference to families. All Forums are delivered virtually. WHAT YOU WILL NEED TO CONFIRM YOUR PLACE:

1. CONSIDER WHERE YOU WILL ACCESS THE TRAINING ON YOUR BOOKED DATES

The virtual training programme is a live online delivery. We ask that you treat this training opportunity as you would a face-to-face training event. They are full day events. Ensure that you make the most of this learning opportunity through:

- Finding a quiet and comfortable space to take part shared offices or clinical spaces may not be suitable due to noise or other possible distractions. If you are able to work from a private workspace or your home for the event this may be helpful.
- Accessing via device with a video camera/webcam e.g. a laptop or a desktop PC with a webcam. This is essential to enable you to engage fully in the session as you need to see and be seen, particularly during group activities. iPads can lose charge, overheat and won't give you a view of all the other participants. Smartphone screens are limited in size making full participation challenging.
- **Using a reliable internet connection** the training is being delivered live so you will need dependable internet access for the duration of the event.

The preparation is an introductory module for the programme, and it is vital that you complete this to be able to participate in the training. There is guidance on the use of Zoom, an introduction to iHV and our training/Champions programmes and resources. You will also be asked to read a policy or evidence document ahead of an activity within the training. *Please schedule at least one hour to complete this pre-work.*

- 1. Reservations are accepted on a first-come-first-served basis on receipt of a completed application form indicating line management support and access to funding. We ask you to provide your finance dept details and activate finance processes e.g. raising a purchase order to cover your place when you send your application.
- 2. Your place is only considered confirmed by us once your place has been invoiced approx. 4 weeks before the event.
- 3. If we are unable to accommodate you at this event you will be offered an alternative date for the next scheduled event. The iHV reserve the right to review the applications received and to rescind/refuse access to training to individuals requesting places or to request further information.
- 4. Once your place is confirmed and we have invoiced you may become liable for cancellation fees as detailed below.



CANCELLATION:

- 1. Cancellations will be accepted in writing **BY EMAIL ONLY to Training@ihv.org.uk**; verbal cancellations will not be accepted at any time. Should you need to cancel, please send your cancellation request to training@ihv.org.uk.
- 2. Cancellations received on/ or prior to 5pm 28 days prior to training will be refunded in full subject to a £25 administration fee. Any outstanding invoices awaiting payment at the time of cancellation are subject to the same terms and conditions.
- 3. Cancellations received after less than 28 days prior to training will be subject to the following scale of fees: 50% of cost of place refunded if cancelled less than 4 weeks prior to the event; 25% of the cost of place refunded if cancelled less than 2 weeks prior to the event; no refund if cancelled 7 days or less before training event.
- 4. In the unlikely event that the training is cancelled by the iHV due to unforeseen circumstances, the cost of the training place will be refunded in full (via the original payment method).
